Introduction

Heavy rain hit Alhudaydah Governorate during the last week and led to damage in many IDPs sites.

Incident Description

Heavy rain hit Alhudaydah Governorate on Tuesday 09/08/2022 and lasted for many hours covering different districts including Hays and Alkhukha districts in two districts (Hays and Alkhukha). The downpours which lasted for several hours have exposed hundreds to homeless and leading to widespread floods that devastated IDPs shelters, food items and NFIs in these IDPs sites. Now most households are in the open air. An old woman died as she was washed away by floods.

Recommendations

The following is recommended:

- 1. Quick response by humanitarian partners and NGOs to provide assistance to the affected household.
- 2. Quick response to assist vulnerable households affected by rain and floods.
- 3. Executing raising awareness sessions about the dangers of rainfall and how to prepare and be ready for rain fall especially seasonal ones.
- 4. The local authorities should execute field visits to the affected sites to evaluate and provide assistance.
- 5. The local authorities should provide facilitate humanitarian partners, INGOs and NGOs access to the affected area

Conclusion

Heavy rain hit Alhudaydah Governorate on Tuesday 09/08/2022 and downpours which lasted for several hours have exposed hundreds to homeless and leading to widespread floods that devastated IDPs shelters, food items and NFIs in these IDPs sites. The rainfall affected (297) households, (43) shelters were completely damaged, (232) shelters were partially damaged, (220) NFIs were completely damaged, (31) were partially damaged and (224) food items were completely damaged. The households are living in the open air now. An old woman died as she was washed away by floods. No intervention is reported.
