

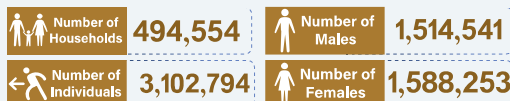


Executive Unit for IDPs Camp Humanitarian Needs Report November 2022

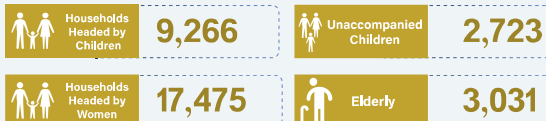

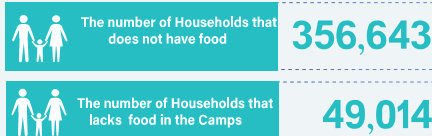

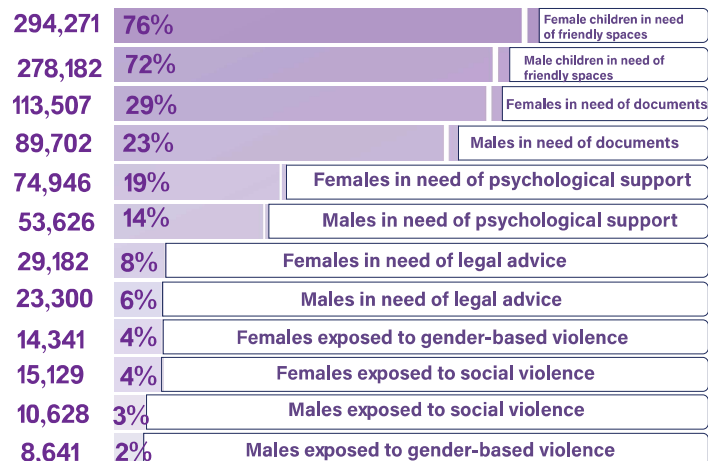

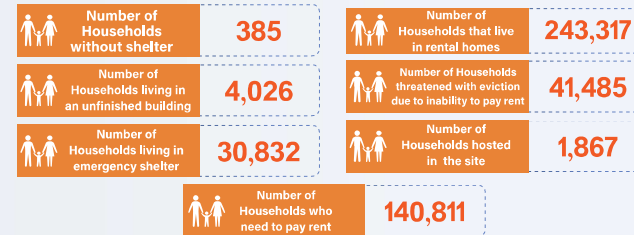
