

New Displacement

During the first quarter of 2023, approximately (3,133 households) (16,141individuals) were newly displaced. These households have been come from 20 governorates (188 districts) and they were received by 10 governorates (34 districts).

The main reasons for displacement:


- 1 Armed conflict

- 5 Natural disasters

* Internally displaced persons (IDPs) : Persons or groups of persons who had to flee or to leave their homes or places of habitual residence, in particular as a result of or in order to avoid the effects of armed conflict, situations of violence, violations of human rights or natural disasters, and who have not crossed an internationally recognized state border.


During the first quarter of 2023, it was recorded that nearly 10 governorates received the new displacement.




Areas of Origin before Displacement



IDPs Departure

During the first quarter of 2023, approximately (30 households) (132 individuals) left their current locations of displacement. These households departed from 6 governorates (7 districts), and 7 governorates (11 districts) received them.

The main reasons for displacement:

- 1. Renewed armed conflict
- 2. Searching for better livelihood opportunities
- 3. Violations and prosecutions
- 4. Forced eviction
- 5. Desire to return home
- 6. Inability to pay rent
- 7. Fires and torrents
- 8. Diseases and epidemics
- 9. IDPs departed do not receive support from organizations.

And other reasons...

*IDPs Departed: They are the IDPs who left their current governorates of displacement for other ones.








Internal mobility within the same governorate from one district to another.



During the first quarter of 2023, (01 January - 31 March), approximately (3,133-households) (16,141 individuals) were newly displaced.

This requires that all these households should receive many urgent and rapid interventions to meet their needs; this is one of the rights of the displaced persons. Such humanitarian interventions include various types, the simplest of them, for instance, is: Rapid Response Mechanism (RRM), It was reported that not more than (895) households, i.e. only 29% of the new displacement, received RRM.
