



## Emergency Report on Rain and Floods Causing Severe Damage in IDP Camps in Hadramawt, Al-Jawf, Shabwa, Abyan and Al-Dhalea Governorates

**Date: 16 – 21 April 2024**

### Introduction

Heavy rainfall, caused by low air pressure, occurred in the Governorates of Hadramawt, Al-Jawf, Shabwah, Abyan, and Al-Dhalea, impacting these regions overall and particularly affecting IDP camps. In Hadramawt Governorate, heavy rains led to flooding in the districts of Sayun, Mukalla, and Al Abr. Damage was observed in the camps of Maryamah, Madouda, Hawsh Al-Aidarous, and Northern Gharran, affecting approximately 800 households, where their shelters, NFIs, and food were partially or completely damaged. Efforts are underway to assess and mitigate this extensive damage, with expectations of an increase in the number of affected families.

During Friday evening, heavy rain poured down on the of Al-Rayyan area (Khub and Al-Shaaf District - Al-Jawf Governorate), resulting in damage at the Northern Gharran camp. Initial numbers reached 1,700 households (approximately 9,100 individuals) have been affected by the rainfall and floods, where their shelters, NFIs, and food were partially or completely damaged.. Northern Gharran Camp is scattered between Alber in Hadramawt and Al-Rayyan area in Al Jawf Governorate.

In Shabwah governorate, specifically in Bayhan district, heavy rains fell, which led to floods that affected IDP camps, and the Executive Unit in Shabwah Governorate monitored that 30 HHs were affected as a result of these rains and floods, where their shelters, NFIs, and food were partially damaged.



In Abyan governorate, the Executive Unit monitored the damage to IDP camps in Zinjibar district, Tumaisi camp, where 458 HHs were affected as a result of rain and floods. Monitoring and assessment of the damage are still in progress.

In Al-Dhalea governorate, Qatabah District, the Executive Unit monitored the damage of 50 HHs, where their shelters, NFIs, and food were partially or completely damaged, as a result of the rain and floods that fell as a result of this depression.

The following table shows the extent of damage caused by rain, floods and winds at the IDP camps in addition to the number of households.

## Executive Unit Procedures

Since the announcement of the depression, the Executive Unit has worked continuously to follow up on the situation, the affected sites and the affected camps in the governorates. Executive Unit has carried out a package of measures at the level of governorates, districts and the main office, which include the following:

- The Executive Unit visited the sites immediately after the rain and floods to document the damage and assess the situation.
- The local authorities were contacted to inform them of the necessary needs
- Forming emergency committees and field teams in governorates, districts and camps to monitor and assess the situation in coordination with local authorities and humanitarian partners.
- The evaluation is still in progress by the Executive Unit in some governorates due to the huge damage.



- Detailed reports on damage and needs were prepared by delegates in the governorates
- Issuing an emergency report on damages (A Report on all governorates)
- Forming WhatsApp groups to closely follow up the situation in the ExU Head Office and the governorates affected.

## Recommendations

The Executive Unit recommends the following

1. The need for urgent intervention by international organizations and non-governmental organizations to provide emergency assistance to the affected households.
2. It is necessary to find permanent and effective mechanisms to Confronting the challenges posed by climate change.
3. It is necessary to exert collaborative efforts between local authorities and non-governmental organizations to identify safe locations, away from flood-prone areas, for IDP camps.

## Summary

Intense rainfall and floods have occurred and persisted across numerous governorates of the Republic, attributed to a weather depression. Many IDP camps in Hadramawt, Al-Jawf, Shabwah, Abyan, and Al-Dhalea were impacted. The Executive Unit in these governorates has been monitoring affected households, visiting the sites and camps with ongoing assessments in progress in some, like Hadramawt, Abyan, and Al-Jawf. Further updates will be provided as available.
