



Report on the Damages Caused by Rains and Floods in Hadhramaut Governorate

Date: August 13-20, 2024

Summary:

Recent heavy rainfall, driven by climate change, has caused significant flooding in various districts of Hadhramaut Governorate, including Al-Abr, Al-Sawm, Mukalla, Al-Raida and Qusayr. These floods have severely impacted 222 IDP HHs living in camps, resulting in both partial and complete damage to shelters and INFs and food.

Immediate Needs:

Given the extent of the damage, the most urgent needs are as follows:

1. Shelters: There is an immediate requirement for emergency shelters to replace the ones that have been damaged or destroyed. This includes the provision of tents, tarpaulins, and other temporary housing solutions.
2. Non-Food Items (NFIs): Essential non-food items such as blankets, clothing, and hygiene kits are urgently needed to support the affected population.
3. Food Supplies: The floods have disrupted the food supply in the IDPs camps, making the provision of emergency food assistance critical. The following table shows the affected households, the damages and the needs.

Executive Unit Procedures

The Executive Unit has been working continuously to monitor the situation in the affected governorate, including the impacted sites and camps. It has implemented a comprehensive package of actions including:

- Visit sites affected immediately after the rainfall to document the damage, assess the situation and identify needs.
- Communicate with local authorities in the affected governorates and coordinate with humanitarian partners to provide humanitarian assistance to the affected families
- Follow up on updates on the field developments, assess, identify the needs, issuing reports and sharing them with humanitarian partners.
- Coordinate with humanitarian partners to conduct urgent interventions.

Recommendations

The Executive Unit recommends the following

- It is necessary to implement urgent interventions by international organizations and non-governmental organizations to provide emergency assistance to affected households.
- Strengthening the capacity of the Executive Unit by completing the equipping of the Early Warning Centre in order to reduce the effects of climate change.
- It is necessary to find permanent and effective mechanisms to confront climate change in coordination with the relevant government agencies.
- It is necessary to exert joint collaborative efforts between local authorities and non-governmental organizations to identify safe locations, away from flood-prone areas, for IDP camps.
