# Report on Displacement Movement in Al Hodeidah and Taiz Governorates



## 1. Executive Summary

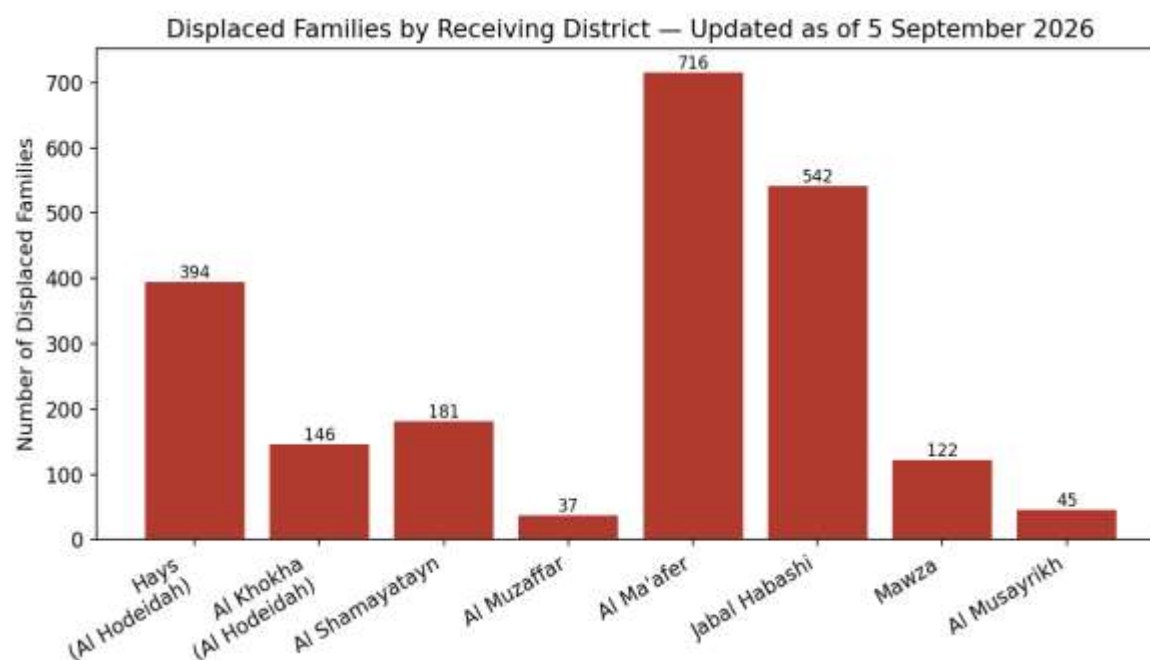
As of September 5, 2026, Al Hodeidah and Taiz governorates witnessed a sharp escalation in displacement, totaling 2,183 displaced families across eight receiving districts due to ongoing military operations and Houthi militia shelling of populated villages and camps. In Al Hodeidah, the cumulative total rose to 540 families across Hays and Al Khokha districts, driven by escalating security deterioration. In Taiz, displacement reached 1,643 families, concentrated in Al Ma'afer, Jabal Habashi, Al Shamayatayn, Mawza, Al Muzaffar, and the newly recorded Al Musayrikh district, while Maqbanah remained a primary point of origin for secondary displacement. These newly tracked families face urgent humanitarian needs in shelter, food, water, and protection, with current figures remaining preliminary and subject to ongoing field verification.

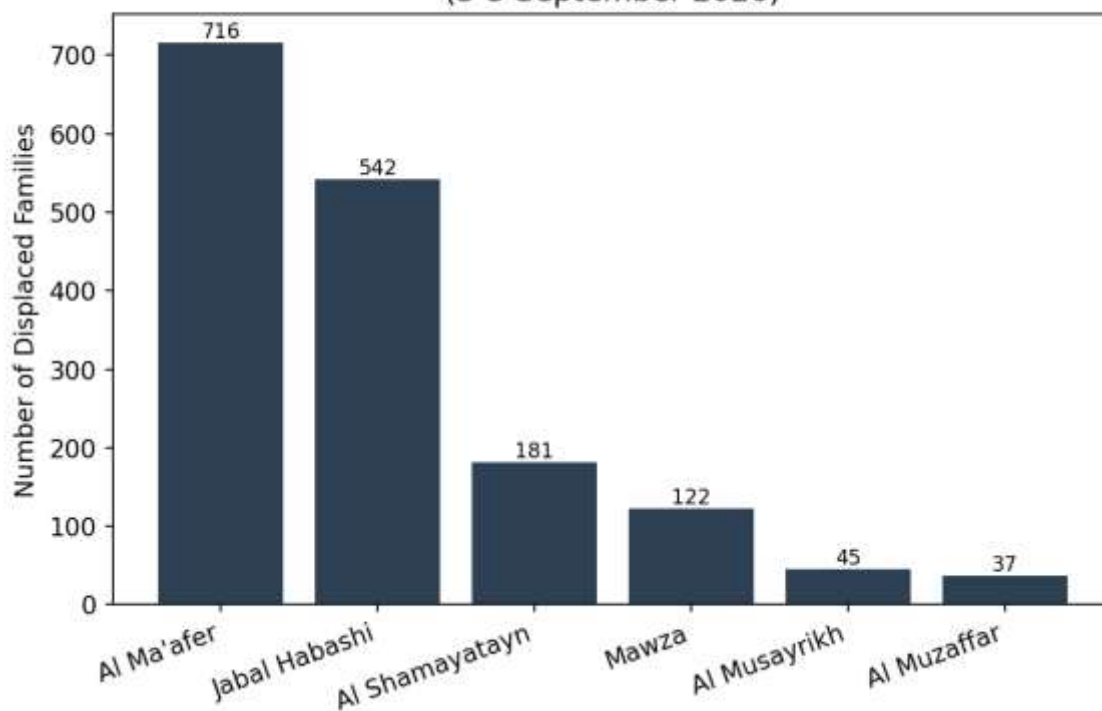

(3-5 September 2026)



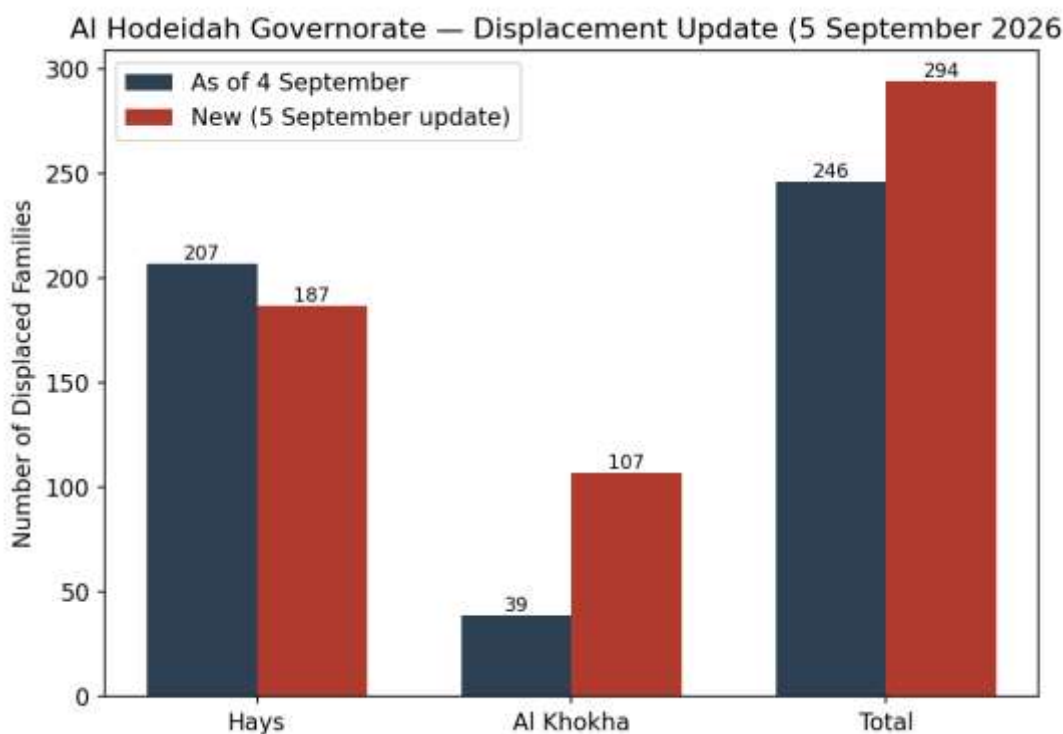
#### 4. Al Hodeidah Governorate

Hays district and its surrounding areas witnessed an escalation of hostilities and shelling during the recent period, degrading the security situation and increasing risks to civilian life and safety, and pushing more families to forcibly leave their areas of origin in search of safer locations. Displaced families arrived in various areas of Hays and Al Khokha districts under difficult conditions, after many were forced to leave behind their homes, belongings, and sources of income.



The cause of displacement is the escalation of military operations and shelling in residential areas and their surrounding areas.

#### 4.1 Humanitarian Situation of Displaced Families

The majority of displaced families arrived in difficult humanitarian conditions after suddenly leaving their areas, abandoning their homes, belongings, and sources of income — directly affecting their ability to meet their basic needs. Displaced families face multiple needs, most notably shelter and core relief items, food, and safe drinking water, alongside limited access to health and protection services, with additional needs among the groups most exposed to risk, including children, women, the elderly, persons with disabilities, and families with members suffering from chronic illnesses. The loss or damage of income sources, property, livestock, and other livelihood assets has also increased the economic fragility of



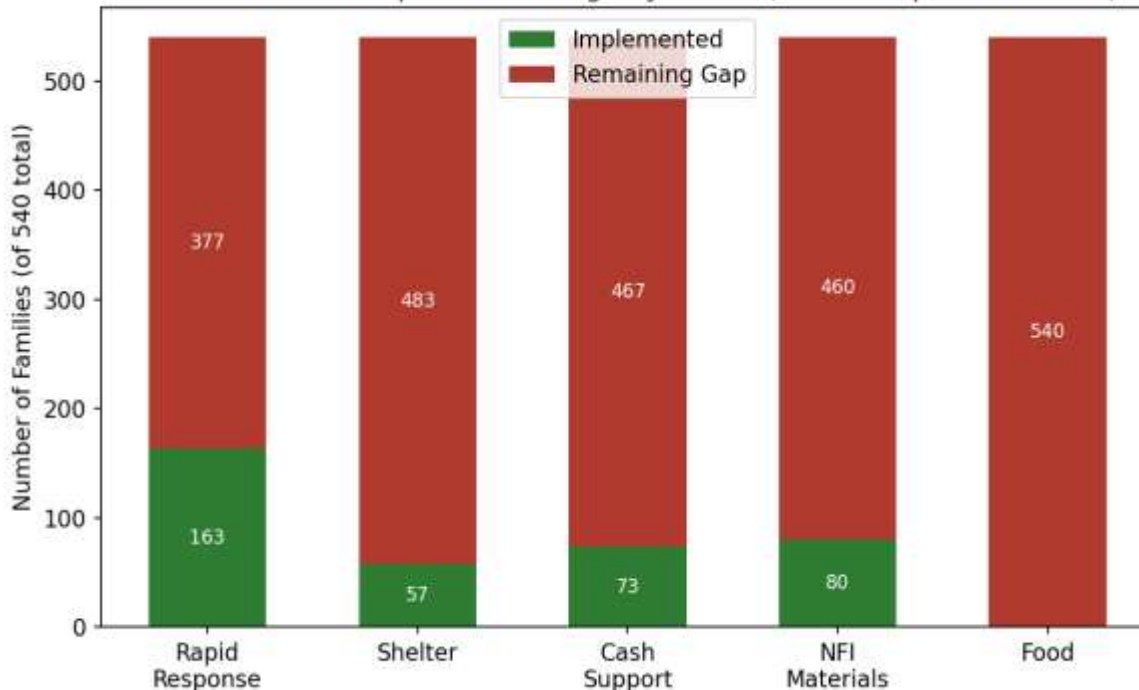
displaced families, leaving a number of them unable to meet their basic needs without urgent humanitarian assistance.

#### 4.2 Displacement Movement and Response — Sector Coverage (as of 5 September 2026)

The table below sets out, per district, the number of families for whom each type of assistance has been implemented versus those for whom it remains outstanding, out of the cumulative total of 540 displaced families.

Food assistance shows the largest outstanding gap (540 families, 0 implemented), followed by shelter (483 remaining) and cash support (467 remaining). Al Khokha district has received markedly less coverage





than Hays across all sectors except the rapid response mechanism, where partial coverage has reached 16 of 146 families.

### 4.3 Actions Taken by the Al Hodeidah Executive Unit

1. Receiving newly displaced families.
2. Newly conducting a headcount of recently displaced families, through field visits to arrival areas and displacement gathering points.
3. Initial verification of family numbers and locations, and collection of basic data on displacement circumstances and initial humanitarian needs; field teams also monitor and assess initial needs and continuously update displacement movement data.
4. Preparing and submitting lists of the names of displaced persons.
5. Submitting reports to the Executive Unit's leadership, local authorities, relevant parties, and concerned humanitarian partners, to help accelerate verification, referral, and response procedures and ensure field information reaches actors capable of intervening.
6. As part of its coordination responsibilities, the Executive Unit continues to follow up on the response status and to liaise with relevant parties on cases not yet covered, alongside tracking implemented interventions and updating remaining gaps, to help direct efforts and resources toward the families and areas most in need and reduce duplication of assistance.
7. Executive Unit field teams continue their work using all available means to ensure ongoing tracking of displacement movement, updated figures and needs, and prompt reporting of developments, particularly in light of the continuing current escalation and the likelihood of additional displacement in the coming days.

### 4.4 Priorities and Proposed Urgent Actions — Al Hodeidah

Given the continuation of displacement and the current escalation in the area, and given that a number of displaced families remain without any assistance as of the date of this report, the Executive Unit for Management of IDP Camps in Al Hodeidah governorate calls on relevant government bodies, humanitarian organizations, clusters, and concerned sectors to urgently move and respond to the pressing humanitarian needs of displaced families — particularly cases not yet covered by any intervention — and to accelerate verification, assessment, and response procedures, covering existing gaps in shelter and NFIs, WASH, the rapid response mechanism, food, and protection.

1. Give immediate priority to displaced families not yet targeted, especially those who arrived after 31 August — an estimated 351 families pending headcount — and conduct a multi-sectoral assessment for them without delay.



2. Complete the reconciliation of Rapid Response Mechanism beneficiary lists in the area, and link beneficiary families to displacement dates and locations, to prevent duplication and accurately determine the actual gap.
3. Expedite the disbursement of previously approved cash assistance for shelter and for NFIs to the 39 families in Al Khokha whose targeting was already approved, once list verification is complete.
4. Task WASH partners with an urgent assessment focused on safe water, emergency latrines, hygiene items, and waste management at new displacement sites and gathering points.
5. Mobilize food security and protection partners to conduct specialized assessments and activate priority referrals and responses based on assessment findings.
6. Adopt a unified daily update on displacement movement and response at the district level, separating 'planned' from 'implemented,' and documenting the implementing party, intervention date, and the unique (de-duplicated) family count.

#### 4.5 Recommendations and Humanitarian Appeal — Al Hodeidah

Amid continuing displacement and a number of families still without adequate response, the Executive Unit appeals to government bodies, humanitarian organizations, clusters, and donors to urgently move and mobilize resources to cover pressing needs, prioritizing the most recently displaced and most vulnerable families. It recommends:

1. Accelerating the response for uncovered families, and not delaying urgent interventions where clear humanitarian needs exist.
2. Completing coverage through the Rapid Response Mechanism and reconciling beneficiary lists to identify gaps and avoid duplication.
3. Accelerating coverage of shelter and NFI needs, and mobilizing WASH partners to assess newly-reached sites and respond to identified gaps.
4. Mobilizing food security and protection partners to conduct specialized assessments and activate priority referrals and responses.
5. Implementing sectoral assessments in parallel with urgent response, without letting the wait for assessments delay essential assistance.
6. Raising the level of readiness and coordination, and continuously updating displacement and response data in anticipation of continued or increased displacement.
7. Appealing to donors and humanitarian organizations to provide the resources needed to expand the response and ensure that no displaced family remains without the minimum level of humanitarian assistance.

*Summary (Al Hodeidah): Field data indicate continued new displacement movement in Hays and Al Khokha districts, with displaced families being registered over successive periods, including recent cases not yet*





*covered by any humanitarian response as of the date of this report. Interventions implemented so far — notably through the Rapid Response Mechanism, shelter support, cash assistance, and shelter-related support — have helped cover part of the needs, but the level of coverage remains uneven across cases and areas, and clear gaps remain that call for an urgent and coordinated response.*

## 5. Taiz Governorate

The districts of Al Ma'afer, Jabal Habashi, Al Shamayatayn, Mawza, Al Muzaffar, and Al Musayrikh in Taiz governorate witnessed continuous military escalation by Houthi militias during 3–5 September 2026, targeting sub-districts, villages, and IDP camps. This resulted in widespread forced displacement and secondary displacement waves (re-displacement of previously displaced persons) toward more distant districts. Maqbanah district, previously a receiving area, is in this period a district of origin only — families continued onward from Maqbanah's sub-districts (Al Yaman, Al Qahifah, Himyar and others) into Jabal Habashi, Al Ma'afer, and Al Muzaffar.

### 5.1 Al Ma'afer District

Al Sawa'a and Al Mashawilah sub-districts in Al Ma'afer received the largest number of displaced families in this update, arriving from Jabal Habashi camps (Al Rajhi and Al Rahbah), Maqbanah sub-districts (Al Yaman, Al Tuwair, Al Qahifah, Al Afirah), and internal displacement from Al Kadha area.

A total of 716 families (4008 individuals) were displaced to Al Ma'afer district during the 3–5 September 2026 period.

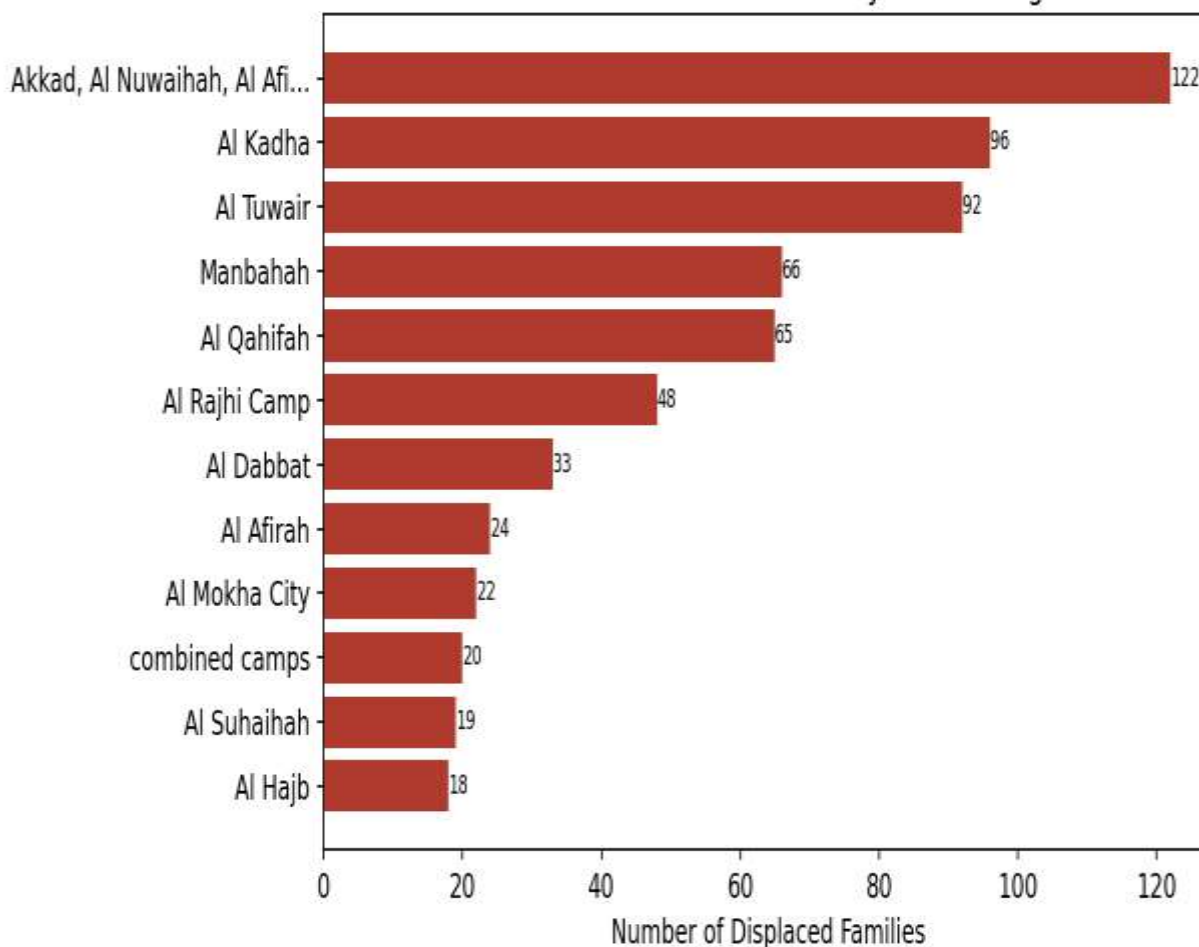

## 5.2 Jabal Habashi District

Displacement into Jabal Habashi continued from Al Sharajah sub-district camps (Al Rahbah, Al Rajhi, Al Dabbab) and from Maqbanah's Al Qahifah and Al Kuwaihah areas, with additional movement recorded on 5 September toward Bani Khawlan sub-district.

A total of 542 families (2826 individuals) were displaced to Jabal Habashi district during the 3–5 September 2026 period.

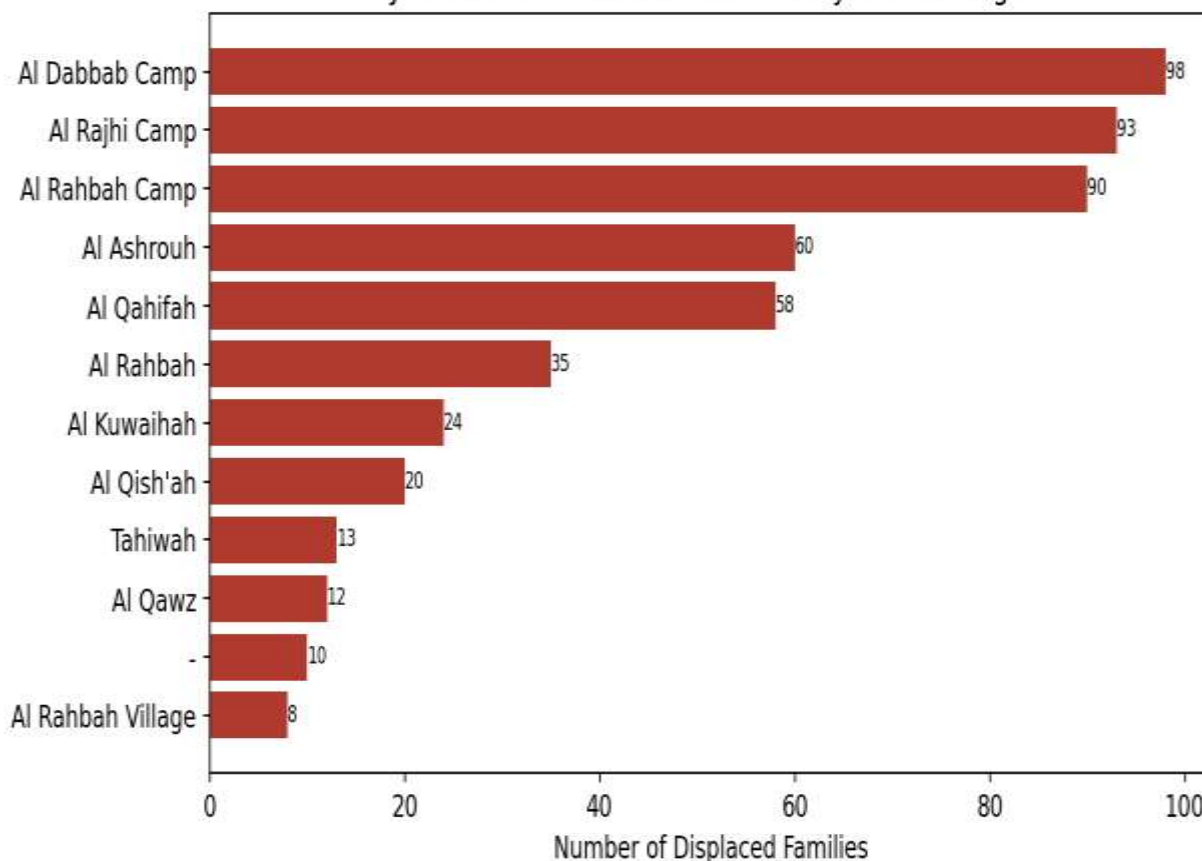

### 5.3 Al Shamayatayn District

The majority of families arrived from Al Kadha area (Al Ma'afer district) and Al Hajb sub-district (Maqbanah) toward Dab'a Al Dakhil and Dab'a Al Kharij sub-districts in Al Shamayatayn district.

A total of 181 families (833 individuals) were displaced to Al Shamayatayn district during the 3–5 September 2026 period.

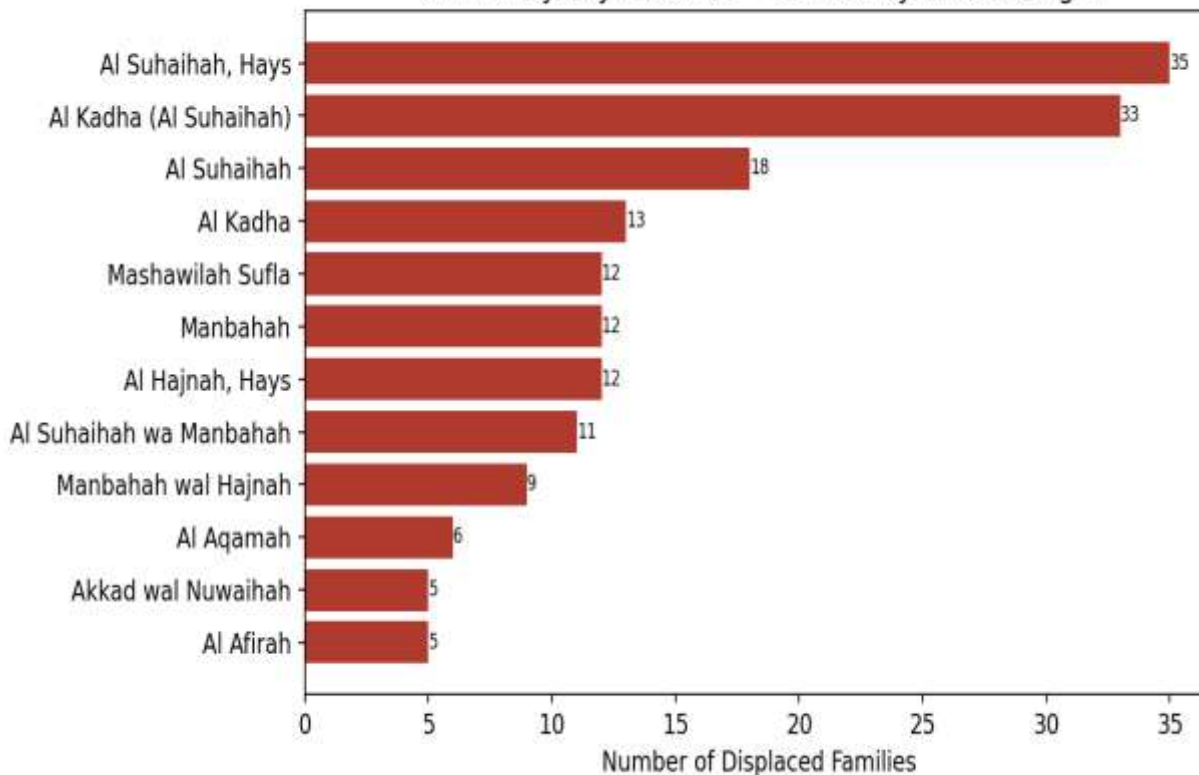

Al Shamayatayn District — Families by Area of Origin



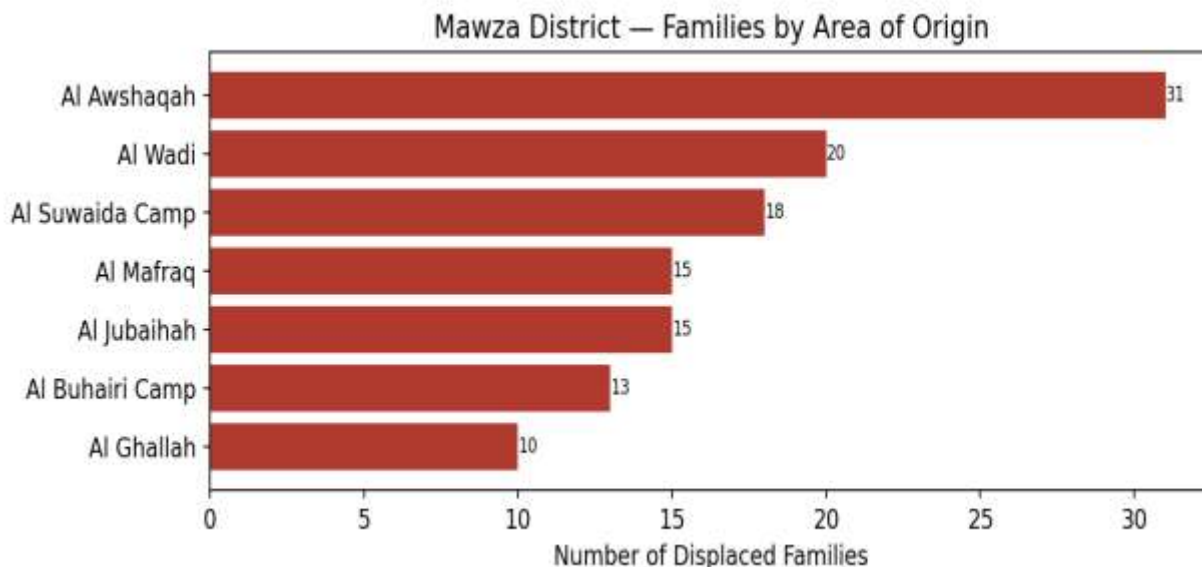


## 5.4 Mawza District

All recorded movement is internal displacement within Al Awshaqah sub-district in Mawza district, from villages and camps toward Mawza center, Al Aysam, and Al Asfouriyah camp. Figures are unchanged from the previous update.

A total of 122 families (732 individuals) were displaced to Mawza district during the 3–5 September 2026 period.

## 5.5 Al Muzaffar District

Al Muzaffar district received numbers of displaced persons arriving from Jabal Habashi, Maqbanah, Al Mokha, Hays (Al Hodeidah), and Shu'aub (Sana'a Capital Secretariat), as part of secondary displacement movement. This update adds a large number of newly recorded, mostly single-family movements on 5 September.

A total of 37 families (222 individuals) were displaced to Al Muzaffar district during the 3–5 September 2026 period.

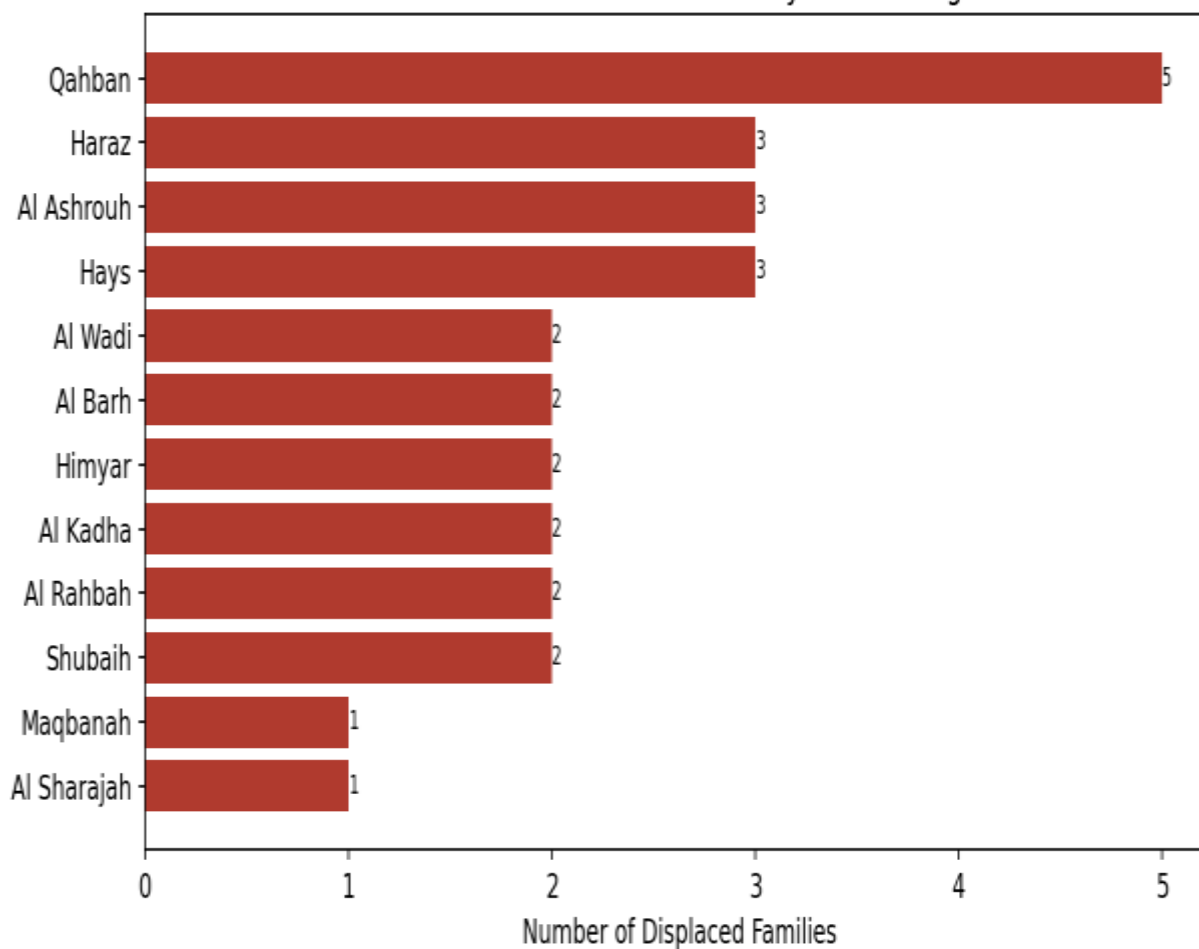

## 5.6 Al Musayrikh District

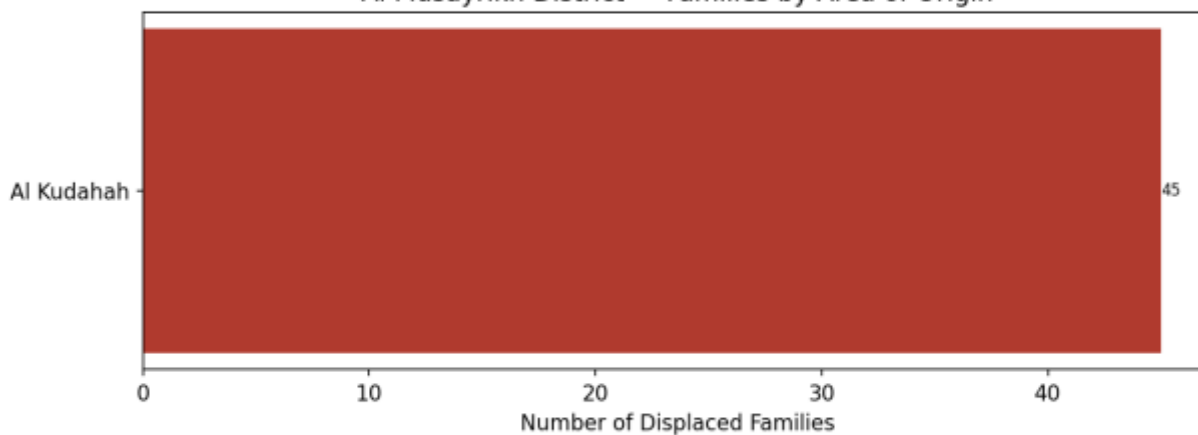
Al Musayrikh district appears for the first time in this update as a receiving district, with families arriving from Al Ma'afer's Al Kadha area over 4–5 September 2026.

## 7. Humanitarian Situation and Urgent Needs

1. Provision of safe and suitable sites to receive displaced families.
2. Shelter and emergency shelter materials for families who lost or left their homes.
3. Food and urgent food and cash assistance.
4. Safe drinking water and sanitation and hygiene services.
5. Healthcare, medicine, and first aid.
6. Protection services, prioritizing children, women, the elderly, persons with disabilities, and families with sick members.
7. Psychosocial support and referral mechanisms for special cases.

## 8. Impact on Displaced Persons and Residents

1. Forced displacement and evacuation of a number of villages and camps.
2. A state of fear, panic, and instability among families.
3. Loss or abandonment of homes and personal property.
4. Increased pressure on areas receiving displaced persons, particularly Al Ma'afer and Jabal Habashi, which together now account for over two-thirds of all Taiz governorate arrivals.
5. Rising humanitarian needs at receiving sites, especially in the newly affected Al Musayrikh district.
6. Possible exposure of children, women, and the most vulnerable groups to additional protection risks.
7. Possible expansion of displacement should the escalation continue.

## 9. Actions Taken by the Executive Unit

1. Formation of field teams to monitor and track the movement of displaced persons and receive them in the districts.
2. Monitoring and registering displaced families and identifying their initial needs.
3. Coordination with humanitarian partners, local authorities, and security bodies to receive displaced persons and facilitate their passage.



4. Communication with international and local organizations and coordination of the humanitarian response.
5. Receiving displaced families and arranging accommodation for some of them in existing, safe camps.

## 10. Recommendations and Appeal to Humanitarian Partners

1. Urgent and immediate humanitarian intervention to assist displaced and affected families in the two governorates.
2. Conducting an urgent, comprehensive, multi-sectoral needs assessment of IDP receiving sites, including the newly affected Al Musayrikh district.
3. Immediate response to basic needs, particularly shelter, food, and water.
4. Including displaced families in emergency cash assistance programs according to approved targeting criteria.
5. Supporting areas receiving displaced persons, particularly Al Ma'afer, Jabal Habashi, Al Shamayatayn, Mawza, Al Muzaffar, Al Musayrikh, Hays, and Al Khokha.
6. Strengthening field coordination among partners to avoid duplication of interventions and ensure aid reaches those most in need.
7. Activating protection, monitoring, and referral mechanisms for the most vulnerable groups.

Note: The displacement movement is ongoing; families continue to be displaced from their areas, and some previously displaced families are undergoing renewed (secondary) displacement.
